PRESENTATION OF THE JUDGES WEB PROJECT **Court decisions to be placed on the Internet**

ZAGREB – The website project “Judges Web”, one of the IT solutions that should improve and speed up court practices in Croatia, was presented on Tuesday at the restaurant “Paviljon” in Zagreb.

The project is about an electronic database accessible to all judges on the Internet (www.sudacka-mreza.hr), containing court decisions. In this way, the court decisions become accessible for the general public, right after being drawn up and sent out, so that the judges actually get an insight into the practices of their colleagues. So far, only a selection of court decisions used to be published in some periodicals and any other exchange of experiences could only be verbal.

- In this experimental phase of the project, the court decisions and other documents will be available only for the judges. Our intention is to test the project, to correct possible mistakes and get feedback from the judges. After that, in a couple of months we'll be ready to go fully public – says for our newspapers Mr Dražen Komarica who, after getting Fullbright scholarship, spent considerable time in research of court practices in Croatia.

In his research, Mr Komarica noticed that the practices vary from one court to another, so he came to the idea of creating the Judges Web, a website in which court decisions would be published, so that the judges could compare their cases with the cases of their colleagues. Although he has plans for opening the project for broader public, Mr Komarica pointed out that the intention was to keep the service free to the judges.

Besides the website, the name “Judges Web” is taken also by the non-governmental and non-profit organization founded in July 1999. Its Internet project, financed mostly from donations, got support by the Ministry of Justice in May 2000. At the moment, the Judges Web has 31 members, among them: Court Presidents, Vice-Presidents, judges, lawyers, law clerks and law students.

PREDSTAVLJEN PROJEKT WEB STRANICA SUDAČKA MREŽA

Sudske presude izlaze na Internet

ZAGREB – Projekt web stranica Sudačka mreža, jednog od informatičkih rješenja koje bi trebalo unaprijediti i ubrzati sudački rad u Hrvatskoj, predstavljen je u utorak u restoranu »Paviljon« u Zagrebu.

Riječ je o informatičkoj bazi podataka dostupnoj svim sucima putem Interneta (www.sudacka-mreza.hr), na kojem se nalaze sudske presude. Na taj način, sudske presude postaju dostupne javnosti, doduše isprva samo sucima, odmah čim su napi-

sane i otposlane i tako suci praktički stječu uvid u praksu svojih kolega. Dosad je, u pojedinim stručnim časopisima, bio objavljivan samo izbor presuda, dok je druga razmjena iskustava ostala na usmenoj predaji.

– U ovoj eksperimentalnoj fazi projekta presude i drugi dokumenti bit će dostupni samo sucima. Namjera je da testiramo projekt, ispravimo moguće pogreške i da dobijemo komentar sudaca. Nakon toga, za nekoliko mjeseci spremni smo ići u potpuno

otvaranje javnosti, kazao je za naš list voditelj projekta Dražen Komarica, koji je zahvaljujući Fullbrightovoj stipendiji duže vrijeme istraživao rad sudova u Hrvatskoj.

Istražujući, Komarica je primijetio da se praksa mijenja od suda do suda, pa je došao na ideju da oblikuje Sudačku mrežu, web-stranice na kojoj bi se objavljivale presude, kako bi suci mogli svoje slučajeve usporediti sa slučajevima svojih kolega. Iako planira otvaranje i široj javnosti, napomenuo je Komari-

ca, namjera je da sucima usluga ostane uvijek besplatna.

Naziv Sudačka mreža, osim web-stranica, ima i nevladina i neprofitna udruga, osnovana u srpnju 1999. godine. Potporu njenom projektu izlaska na Internet, financiranom uglavnom iz donacija, dalo je u svibnju 2000. godine Ministarstvo pravosuđa. Trenutno, Sudačka mreža ima 31 člana, među kojima su predsjednici sudova, njihovi zamjenici, suci, odvjetnici, sudski vježbenici i studenti.
